<u>Pope St. John Paul II Quotes</u>

. Called to salvation through faith in Jesus Christ, "the true light that enlightens everyone" (Jn 1:9), people ccome "light in the Lord" and "children of light" (Eph 5:8), and are made holy by "obedience to the truth" (1 Pet 22). This obedience is not always easy. As a result of that mysterious original sin, committed at the prompting of utan, the one who is "a liar and the father of lies" (Jn 8:44), man is constantly tempted to turn his gaze away om the living and true God in order to direct it towards idols (cf. 1 Thes 1:9), exchanging "the truth about God r a lie" (Rom 1:25). Man's capacity to know the truth is also darkened, and his will to submit to it is weakened. hus, giving himself over to relativism and scepticism (cf. Jn 18:38), he goes off in search of an illusory freedom part from truth itself. But no darkness of error or of sin can totally take away from man the light of God the reator. In the depths of his heart there always remains a yearning for absolute truth and a thirst to attain full towledge of it. This is eloquently proved by man's tireless search for knowledge in all fields. It is proved even ore by his search for the meaning of life. The development of science and technology, this splendid testimony of e human capacity for understanding and for perseverance, does not free humanity from the obligation to ask the 'timate religious questions. Rather, it spurs us on to face the most painful and decisive of struggles, those of the 'art and of the moral conscience.

. No one can escape from the fundamental questions: What must I do? How do I distinguish good from evil? The iswer is only possible thanks to the splendour of the truth which shines forth deep within the human spirit, as the salmist bears witness: "There are many who say: 'O that we might see some good! Let the light of your face shine 1 us, O Lord' " (Ps 4:6). The light of God's face shines in all its beauty on the countenance of Jesus Christ, "the nage of the invisible God" (Col 1:15), the "reflection of God's glory" (Heb 1:3), "full of grace and truth" (Jn 14). Christ is "the way, and the truth, and the life" (Jn 14:6). Consequently the decisive answer to every one of an's questions, his religious and moral questions in particular, is given by Jesus Christ, or rather is Jesus Christ imself, as the Second Vatican Council recalls: "In fact, it is only in the mystery of the Word incarnate that light is ved on the mystery of man. For Adam, the first man, was a figure of the future man, namely, of Christ the Lord. It Christ, the last Adam, who fully discloses man to himself and unfolds his noble calling by revealing the mystery 'the Father and the Father's love".1 Jesus Christ, the "light of the nations", shines upon the face of his Church, hich he sends forth to the whole world to proclaim the Gospel to every creature (cf. Mk 16:15).2 Hence the hurch, as the People of God among the nations,3 while attentive to the new challenges of history and to ankind's efforts to discover the meaning of life, offers to everyone the answer which comes from the truth about 2sus Christ and his Gospel. The Church remains deeply conscious of her "duty in every age of examining the gns of the times and interpreting them in the light of the Gospel, so that she can offer in a manner appropriate to *ich generation replies to the continual human questionings on the meaning of this life id the life to come and on how they are related".4*

O Mary,

Mother of Mercy, watch over all people, that the Cross of Christ may not be emptied of its power, that man may not stray from the path of the good or become blind to sin, but may put his hope ever more fully in God who is "rich in mercy" (Eph 2:4). May he carry out the good works prepared by God beforehand (cf. Eph 2:10) and so live completely "for the praise of his glory" (Eph 1:12).
