LAETARE SUNDAY: comes from the Latin word(s) for the Mass entrance antiphon for Lent's 4TH Sunday "Rejoice Jerusalem, be joyful all who were in mourning." Laetare Sunday is the half-way day between Ash Wednesday & Easter. In the more austere pre-Vatican II Lents, on this weekend flowers could decorate the altars & weddings could be celebrated. Laetare Sunday can be considered a reminder that if one has not started extra Lenten prayer, fasting, or charitable works there is still plenty of time left in Lent to do so. For those who have begun the Lenten spiritual exercises, Laetare Sunday can mean one's personal goals are new readily attainable with half of them accomplished. Then as now rose/pink Mass vestments could be worn by the priest on Lent's 4TH Sunday. The rose/pink color in the liturgy is a half-way color between Lent's purple & Easter's white colors. In the Latin & Romance languages the words for rose & pink are the same. Use of the rose/pink Mass vestments was/is optional.

PURPLE STATUE COVERINGS are customary from Lent's 5TH Sunday thru Holy Saturday. This optional tradition recalls Jesus going into hiding, staying in His native Galilee, due to the Judeans wishing to stone him for saying 'HE' was the Messiah, blasphemy to them. Jesus was also wanted for arrest by The Sanhedrin for this alleged blasphemy. Cf, *John 8:46-53*. This Gospel was always read on Lent's 5TH Sunday Mass prior to Vatican II.
